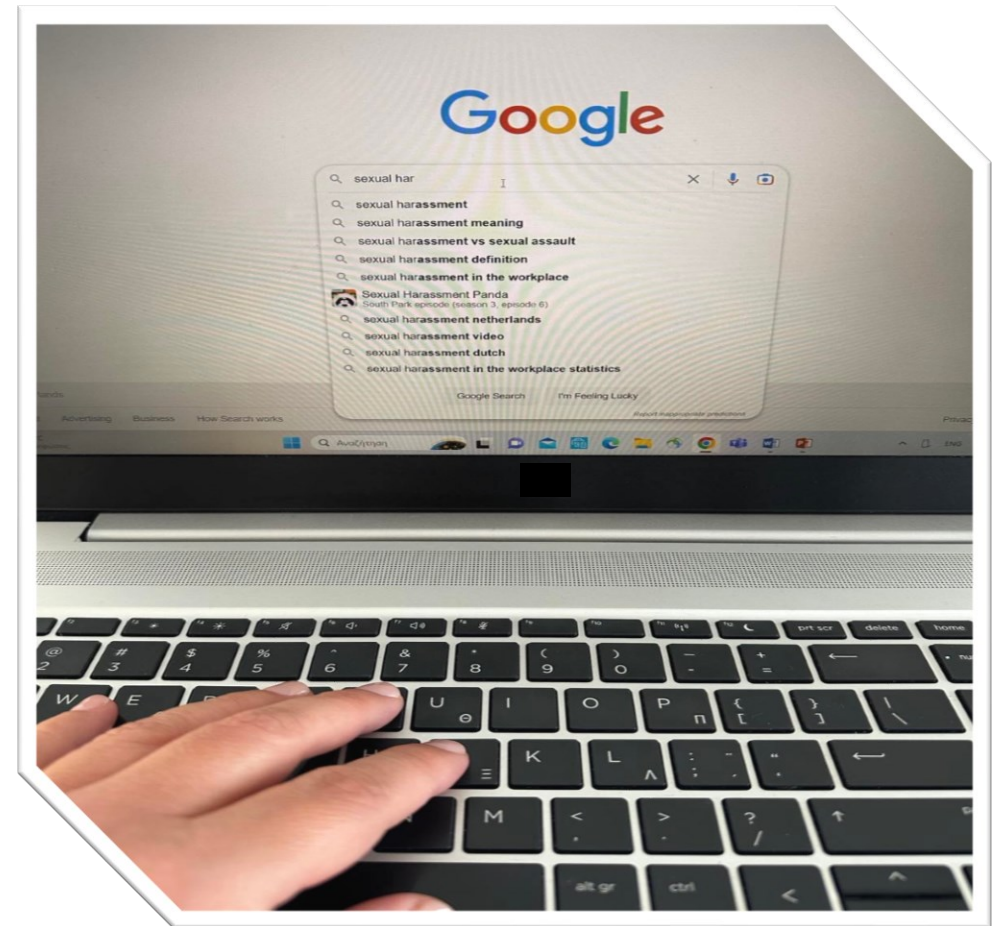
Useful information about searching in the internet: a guide for parents



SEARCHING ONLINE

- ✓ Most of you may have searched information in the Internet for different topics concerning the safety of your children
- ✓ Have you ever wondered if the information you find are reliable?
- ✓ You may find misleading sources and misinformation
- ✓ It is very important to find reliable and correct sources for your information

*Let's see some techniques
that may help you to assess
the sources you find online*



CHARACTERISTICS OF RELIABLE SOURCES

A source can be characterized as “reliable” if it includes the following criteria:

- ✓ written by an expert
- ✓ is explicit and its data can be verified in another sources
- ✓ is unprejudice
- ✓ is current

QUESTIONS FOR YOURSELF

When looking for a source you should ask yourself some questions that will help you to understand if a source is reliable or not.

Let's see these questions...





- What is the date of its publication?
- Does the story match the headline?
- Is it related to the topic that I am looking for?
- Can I identify the same information in another source?



- Who is the author?
- What was the reason for publishing the source? (For example the author has a benefit, or wants to inform or to sell a product/service?)

SOME EXTRA TIPS

The reliability of the sources can be identify also from the url (link). For instance, websites that have in their link the following abbreviation:

.edu are from educational institutions

.gov are from government authorities

.org are from non-profit organizations

BUT

.blogspot refers to personal blog (not always of a scientist)

.com mostly refers to commercial enterprices
